Because you rep many authors who deal with themes of concern to young people, I have a 90,000-word YA Sci Fi/Speculative Fiction I think you will enjoy. It would appeal to readers of Tahereh Mafi's Shatter Me and Lauren Oliver's Delirium. Imagine Stranger Things' Hawkins in the year 2053, where the MC and her mates take on the Hunger Games' Capitol.

It's 2054. In sleepy Portobello on the south coast of New South Wales, Australia, it's hard to know who to trust. Spies are everywhere. The corrupt Goers government sees no future on Earth. In the fire-blackened bushland, the Stayers Resistance is preparing an army. Further up the coast, the Spaceship Aurora is poised on the Australian Space Agency peninsular, ready to blast off to Mars.

Sasha Barnes is a badass blow-in orphan from Sydney caught in the middle. She's an outsider, a freak with latent superpowers and a terrible reputation. All she wants is to find her missing sister. But to do so she needs to get to Mars. And she can't tell anyone that today, her 18th birthday, is her last day on Earth.

Going means betraying her ex-astronaut grandmother Greta, abandoning her little brother, giving up on a future with love interest Billy, and aligning with the Goers. As the battle looms closer, she becomes a pawn between the two sides. But when she finds out her superpowers hold the key to mankind's future on Mars, and that the sister she has risked everything for has set her up, she must decide whether she is a Stayer or a Goer. And whether the dying Earth is worth saving.

This stand-alone novel is the first in a potential series. I am completed my first two drafts through the Writer's Studio, and further courses through the Australian Writers Centre. I belong to a private writer's group. My debut novel has been read by qualified beta readers.

It combines the coming-of-age intensity of Twilight's Bella with the reluctant revolutionary of Hunger Games' Katniss.
